Beslut om stöd

Region Västerbotten beviljar LÄNSSTYRELSEN I VÄSTERBOTTENS LÄN stöd för att genomföra projektet High North Civil Preparedness Forum enligt ansökan inkommen 2025-03-17. Stödet uppgår till 20,19 % av faktiska kostnader och 20,19 % av total finansiering, dock med högst 1 146 946.

Beslutet har fattats med stöd av förordningen (2003:596) om bidrag för projektverksamhet inom den regionala tillväxtpolitiken).

För stödet gäller allmänna villkor enligt Bilaga 1.

Beslutet kan inte överklagas.

Motivering till beslut

Region Västerbotten beviljar stöd av följande skäl:

Projektet följer intentionerna i Västerbottens regionala utvecklingsstrategi prioritering 4 Västerbotten en region med hållbara livsmiljöer att bo, verka och leva i och delprioritering 4.1 Kapacitet för samverkan och samhandling.

Projektet uppfyller kraven fastställda i Region Västerbottens Agenda för hållbar finansiering och bidrar i hög grad till prioritetshöjande aspekten Sammanhållen region och delvis till prioritetshöjande aspekten Hållbar regional tillväxt.

Projektbeskrivning

Syfte: Security dynamics in the High North have deteriorated in recent years, not least following Russias invasion of Ukraine and the following exclusion of Russia from Arctic forums, such as The Barents Euro-Arctic Council and the Arctic Council. At the same time, climate change and melting ice means more of the Arctic and its resources are becoming accessible, which could increase tensions further and lead to military buildup. The region is also important for NATO's military operations in the High North which necessitates civil preparedness to support troops as well as upholding societal functions and protecting

civilians. In short, northern Finland, Sweden and Norway are all part of a region that, from a security perspective, is likely to face many new challenges in the coming years. These challenges should be faced through a strong cross-border cooperation among civil preparedness stakeholders in the High North.

The key stakeholders within civil preparedness see two challenges with facing these threats. Firstly, higher expectations to meet increased civil and military needs and secondly the lack of cross-border cooperation in the High North. The need for increased Nordic cooperation regarding civil preparedness is emphasized by all countries governments in various policy documents, for example the 2024 Haga declaration, the White Paper on Total defence in Norway, the Swedish government proposition 2025-2030 and the Security Strategy for Society: Government resolution in Finland. This project will therefore identify shared risks in the High North, create networking opportunities within civil preparedness through establishing a platform for dialogue and cooperation and create opportunities to share best practices between key stakeholders in Finland, Sweden and Norway.

All project partners have competencies within all work packages and have a role of coordinating civil preparedness within their respective regions.

- Detta kommer uppnås genom att anordna utbildningar, konferenser och workshops.

Därutöver kommer varje arbetspaket utveckla en handlingsplan som identifierar hur resultaten av projektet kan vidareutvecklas efter projektets slut. Dessa handlingsplaner kommer tillsammans utgöra en gemensam strategi.

Building knowledge and competence on host nation support	<p>The focus on civil-military collaboration has gained focus the last years, as the geopolitical situation is more unstable now than it has been the last decades. In this context, host nation support is something that Norway, Sweden and Finland must prepare for.</p> <p>The regional authorities that are represented in this application all have responsibility for coordinating efforts on regional level within their geographical boundaries. NATO in the north has changed since the entry of Sweden and Finland, and the East-West axis has gained importance. For the new members, more knowledge and competence on what host nation support requires is necessary before it can be operationalized. For Norway, the East-West axis has changed focus from mainly hosting foreign military forces to being a transit country for personnel, equipment and supplies.
